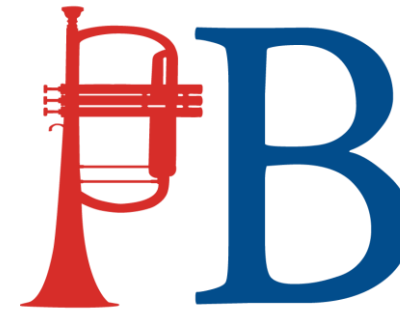
### Our Benefactors
