Liva Savaiinaea | As a flute and piccolo specialist, Liva Savaiinaea has traveled throughout the Tri-state area performing at various events. A recent graduate from Rowan University, Liva has earned his Bachelor of Music with a concentration in flute performance and an Associate of Arts in Music. Liva has studied under Dr. Adeline Tomasone (Opera Company of Philadelphia), Dr. Susanna Loewy (Teaching Artist of the Philadelphia Orchestra and director of Project 440), and Ronna Ayscue (solo recording artist and

orchestral performer). Liva has performed in many masterclasses with world-renowned musicians including Jean Ferrandis (solo recording artist) and Joshua Smith (Cleveland Orchestra).



As a freelance musician, Liva has performed for a multitude of occasions which include weddings, parties, conventions, and many more. Currently, Liva is serving as the second flutist for the Philadelphia Wind Symphony. Some additional ensembles he has participated in include: Philadelphia Sinfonia, Rowan University Wind Ensemble and Orchestra, New Jersey regional and state ensembles. Liva performs on a Muramatsu flute with a Sheridan headjoint and a DiZhao piccolo.

As a performing artist, Liva has an extensive background in competing nationwide as well as internationally. Liva most recently competed in and won the Rowan University Concerto competition during both the 2019-2020 and 2020-2021 academic school year on both flute and piccolo respectively. Additionally, Liva competed in the Eugene Magalif International Flute Concerto competition where he was named as a finalist and the second-place public vote winner.
